## NEP Implementation

### Curriculum Framework

The S.N.M College uses a methodical, purposeful, and open process to guarantee excellent curriculum planning and implementation and is following the affiliated university's curriculum framework. The college views the most important component of the programme as its excellent delivery. The academic calendar is created in accordance with the affiliated university's academic calendar and the Institute's requirements as determined by the action plans. The lesson plan is created in a teachers' diary and contains a personal timetable, information about the subject to be taught, and a list of the topics that were actually covered throughout the course of the semester as compared to the plan. Each department's head inspects the diary once a week, and the principal does so once a month. In addition to the aforementioned, the lesson plan, which covers course objectives, course outcomes, planning and execution of the course, etc., has been in place since 2018–19. The implementation is examined by the principal and head of the department. Every teaching faculty has academic file that includes the information of Individual timetable, Proper lesson plan, Record of attendance, Mentoring Register, Remedial class, Records of Continuous Internal Evaluation.

The college took initiatives to spread the awareness and knowledge about NEP implementation; pamphlets of “National education policy 2020” were distributed to various stakeholders. The college is published the curriculum and credit framework of undergraduate programs and National Education policy in its website. The IQAC has organised faculty program on “Moving towards NEP and implementation of OBE system in Higher Education”

NEP, 2020 aim to increase the GER to 100% in preschool to secondary level by 2030 whereas GER in Higher Education including vocational education from 26.3% (2018) to 50% by 2035.

The Central Sector Scheme Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT) was launched in 2014 to address comprehensively all issues related to Teacher Training/ Capacity Building and Professional Development of Teachers. Under the components, the total 95 Centres were established throughout the country through which faculties/Teachers have been trained. Currently, The Standing Finance Committee has appraised the Scheme and recommended for continuation till 2025-2026 with the total outlay of Rs. 493.68 crore. Under the PMMMNMTT Scheme Centres are established on the basis of the proposals received from education institutions, their screening by Screening Committee and approval by Project Approval Board.

### **Institutional Preparedness of NEP**

**Multidisciplinary/Interdisciplinary:** Multidisciplinary education encourages community involvement, holistic education, and value-based education. The college adheres to the university's curriculum; every undergraduate program's curriculum adheres to the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). All students enrolled in CBCS can take one subject as core course and in the first to fourth semesters they have opportunity to study the courses offered by other departments as Common Course (Languages) and Complementary Course. Students can choose an open course from different fields of science an arts subject without any barrier in the fifth semester. There are certificate courses offering at the institute which focus on multidisciplinary aspects in higher education. Eminent resource persons and academicians entrepreneurs are invited to college to deliver talk/seminars etc. The college has conducted a multidisciplinary international conference in the academic year 2022. To promote research activities in multidisciplinary topics, the institute has its own international journal with ISSN number titled” Journal of current studies”.

**Academic Bank of Credit:** The S.N.M. College follows the academic programme created by the associated university. The Credit Transfer and Accumulation System may be used in the curriculum in accordance with the CBCS Regulation 2017 of Mahatma Gandhi University. A transfer of credit is when one university accepts credits from another institution for programmes or courses that were successfully completed there. Students enrolled in a study at one university may continue their studies at a different university without taking a break thanks to the credit transfer scheme. The university and its associated institutions do not have a full-fledged academic bank of credit as required by the New Economic Strategy of 2020. But students are urged to sign up for online classes.

**Skill Development:** The National Education Policy, 2020 acknowledges the significance of soft skills as essential life abilities, including communication, teamwork, problem solving, decision making, analytical thinking, resilience, etc. The development of soft skills and life skills for the younger generation while integrating them into the educational system can be greatly aided by higher education institutions. Several skill-development programmes were held by S.N.M. College this academic year, but seven skill-based certificate courses (Communication skills in English, Certificate course in Yoga, MS Word and Powerpoint, First Aid and emergency care, value education) stood out. In addition to this, a number of seminars, workshops, training sessions, a two-day soft skill enrichment programme, and readers hub—a platform created to help students enhance their reading, writing, speaking, and communication skills—were organized. A four-day international skill-development webinar called "enrich your English programme" was held to improve students' soft skills and life skills as well as their personalities. Through various competitions, discussions, debates, and other activities, clubs like NCC, NSS, Bhoomitrasena, cultural clubs, unions, entrepreneurship development clubs, readers forums, etc., have actively contributed to the development of teamwork, analytical thinking, problem-solving skills, and resilience among students. Students are also encouraged to take part in government-sponsored programmes for skill development like Additional Skill Acquisition Programme (ASAP). ASAP, a government initiative has been functioning in S.N.M College since 2016 onwards. At Level 1, ASAP imparts 300 hours of skill training to selected first year students (30 per batch, maximum 2 batches in an institution). Of this, 180 hours will be a foundation module comprising of Communication Skills and IT skills and the remaining 120 hours will be the module related to the skill sector chosen by the student. The Programmes are developed, delivered, assessed and certified with the active participation of the related industries to ensure labour market acceptance of the programmes. By imparting communication skills in English and Basic IT courses to a large student community, the project envisages to create a large talent pool that can work in modern day organizations that promote a global work environment. By choice, student groups receive sector specific skills that further enable them to be employable and industry ready. NPTEL Local chapter organized soft skill training program, the students get trained to perform in an interview.

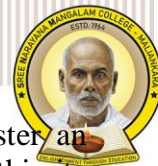

**Integration of Indian Knowledge system:** The study of languages has long been seen as an essential component of education. Indian languages are extremely important in the framework of education that is based on the Indian Knowledge System. The college includes three language departments, and two of them—the Department of Malayalam & Sanskrit and the Department of Hindi—deal with Indian languages. All undergraduate students take a second language course, either Malayalam or Hindi, throughout the course of four semesters in the college's Malayalam degree and postgraduate programmes. Through common, supplementary, and core courses, students are educated about Indian history, culture, literature, heritage, patriotism, and nationalism. Despite the limitations of the syllabus, the institution makes every effort to best incorporate the Indian knowledge system into co-curricular activities. Through the holding of quiz contests, reading competitions, essay competitions, cultural festivals, presenting seminars, etc., colleges commemorate several days associated with Indian languages and culture.

Sree Narayana Mangalam College provides an inclusive environment in the campus with tolerance and harmony and made efforts to spread the concept of Advaitam, the core of Sri Narayana Gurudeva darshana, to the society in all its forms. The college is working to promote the cultural and educational upliftment of the economically and socially disadvantaged sections of the population. The diversity found among its student body, which comprises individuals hailing from families engaged in coir making and fishing. This amalgamation of religious, cultural, and socio-economic backgrounds creates a vibrant and multifaceted campus community. Despite the array of challenges students may face, the

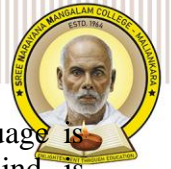
**Mazhamalayalam**: The program organised by department of Malayalam enrich the understanding about the nature and nature related literary works for students.

**Thettillatha Malayalam**: A language lesson was held for SNM LPS Maliankara students on March 6, 2023. The program aims to teach school students about the Malayalam letters and its beginnings. This programme is to promote multilingualism, so a shared vision has to be developed

**Basheeranusmaranam**: To create awareness about Vaikkam Muhammed Basheer and his contributions to Malayalam literature. The legendary Vaikom Muhammad Basheer holds a noteworthy standing in the Malayalam literary world. Basheer had created a style of his own with his insightful and straightforward writing, a dash of satire, sarcasm, and dark humour, and he had established himself as a short story writer, novelist, humanist, as well as a freedom fighter.

**Kaliyattam**: This activity gives students the chance to express themselves, gain self-confidence, and develop social skills that are vital to their development and should be seen as an integral element of education.



**Bharanabhashavaracharanam:** In order for humanity to adapt and advance, language is crucial. The Sustainable Development Goals' emphasis on leaving no one behind is acknowledged by Mother Language as a way that languages and multilingualism may promote inclusion. 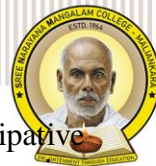


**Vayanadinacharanam (Reading Day):** This program aims to enrich reading habit, is not only promotes knowledge acquisition but also aids in learning, concentration, and communication abilities. The students of the institution actively participated and made a forum for newspaper reading.

**Karanasan-150th janmadinaghosham & Publishing of manuscript magazine:** The program creates awareness about Kumaranasan and his works among students to promote the creativity and writing skills of students.

**Outcome based Education:** A student-centred teaching and learning approach called outcome-based education (OBE) plans course delivery and evaluation to accomplish predetermined goals and results. It emphasises gauging student performance, or results at various stages. Students are provided with specific goals, frequent assessments of their progress, and personalised feedback on how well they have met those objectives.

The teaching learning process has been implemented by giving assignments, seminars and test papers on time. The teachers are also encouraged to include Power point presentations, video lectures and discussions for properly conveying the concepts to the students. The academic system has been recently modified with blended learning. This method gives the student a blended learning experience based on four quadrant system. The students are given classes on the topics based on the syllabus. In addition to that, the students are given work sheets, assignments and discussions based on the topics from the syllabus which increases their problem solving skills and learning experiences through interactive learning process. This kind of participative learning process helps the students with depth in knowledge and enhances their teaching learning experiences. The students are also given experimental learning experiences (including industrial visits, field trip etc) wherever it is applicable according to the syllabus. It is mandatory for all the students to do project for the successful



completion of the course which increases their skill in experimental learning, participative learning and problem solving skills. The students are also involved in various extension programs and activities which will improve their organization skills and capability.

Of these internal exams, the academic calendar publishes the tentative date for exams. The principal and the HODs make an early announcement of the detailed examination schedule. The answer sheets are cross checked in each department to ensure transparent and unbiased evaluation. Internal viva and practical tests are held by the appropriate departments prior to or following the pre-university exams in the case of laboratories and projects. Every Head of Department keeps a monthly report on the subjects covered in each course, the number of students in attendance, and the assignments given. For students who struggle in conceptual courses, remedial lessons are offered.

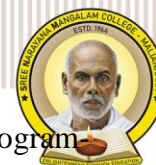
Organizing all academic programmes (curricula) and instructional activities around clearly defined "outcomes" that all students are able to attain when they have finished the programme. Each program having Course Outcomes, Program Outcomes and Program Specific Outcomes and is used for mapping of CO, PO, & PSO. The head of department and the concerned teacher is responsible for PO, CO, PSO mapping. The course attainment is calculated by direct method from internal assessment and from indirect method of feedback system. If the student has low attainment, then the concerned department should immediately take action for her/his improvement.

Each course's course objectives are listed in the program's syllabus. The final course attainment should adhere to the following rules:

1. Adheres to Bloom's taxonomy.
2. There should be a maximum of six COs each course

### **PO-CO-PSO Mapping**

The evaluation of course attainment is done by direct and indirect methods. Course Outcomes (COs) are mapped with the respective Programme Outcomes (POs) and Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs). The PO, PSO, and COs specified for each course serve as the basis for setting up of continuous internal assessment. A collection of performance criteria is utilized to offer a quantitative assessment of how effectively course outcomes are met for each



course. These performance criteria are linked to the programme outcomes and programme specific outcomes for each course.

The Programme Outcomes and Programme Specific Outcomes are mapped to the Course Outcomes with three levels of attainment:

- Strongly Related, with a weight of 3
- Moderately Related, with a weight of 2
- Related, with a weight of 1.

The course outcomes reflect different cognitive levels of each course. The direct assessment methods such as internal exams, assignment, quizzes, seminars etc are the part of CIE. The question paper for the internal exam is done on the basis of Revised Bloom's Taxonomy. To calculate the examination attainment levels of the courses, the threshold value of 70 percent of students getting 35 percent of marks weighted as 3, 50 percent of students getting 35 percent of marks as 2 and 35 above percent of students getting 35 percent of marks as 1 for Continuous Internal Assessment. In the indirect method, the Course Outcomes with Programme Outcomes and Programme Specific Outcomes will be validated through a feedback mechanism.

$$\text{Course Attainment} = 80\% \text{ from direct method} + 20\% \text{ from indirect method}$$

The first year students have gone through the bridge course before entering into the syllabus of the program. Proper mentoring with all student and their profiles, records of mentoring are kept by the mentor. Identification of slow learner and advanced learner can be done in the final assessment process and make necessary actions. Remedial sessions were arranged for improvement of weak students and thorough work for getting maximum CO, PO & PSO attainment for each program.

**Distance education/online education:** The College prefers online learning systems to help students complete their graduation requirements because of the COVID-19 pandemic condition. In order to make online classrooms more interactive, engaging, and informative all at once, the College has established an LMS platform (<https://snmcvirtual.online/>), and the faculties keep up with current teaching techniques and technologies. Through ICT-enhanced technology, the LMS platform offers online lessons and includes defined modules for each subject. The SNM virtual platform, where students can quickly access the course information wherever they are, has a discussion forum, attendance tracking, and several evaluation options (tests, assignments, etc.). The SNMC Virtual incorporates the ICT-based teaching methods. The video lessons were delivered through SNMC Virtual and the assignments and internal examinations were conducted and valued through the platform. The maintenance of the E repository added to the smooth functioning of activities related to IQAC, the departments and the supporting units.

Since it is crucial that ICT be used effectively to train teachers in the institution, the IQAC of the college ran a number of faculty training programmes throughout the year. The evaluation methodology is a necessary for online education as well, both for quality assurance and to give feedback on teaching and learning. The college's IQAC has carefully maintained an appropriate evaluation/assessment approach that aids in evaluating students' topic knowledge and comprehension despite their varying skills. During the academic year, all teaching methods at the institute encourage the appropriate and efficient use of the online LMS platform. The students and staff at SNM College were encouraged to enroll in the online certificate programmes offered by SWAYAM as the college had signed up as a local chapter of NPTEL-SWAYAM Courses. The MOOC course on Organic Farming is implemented by the University in 2020 as mandatory; all students are enrolled in the course during the first year.
