8. Objective of the Program: To inculcate basic knowledge about the human rights and contemporary Indian democracy among students

9. Detailed description of the event:

The One -day National Seminar sponsored by the Institute of Parliamentary Affairs, Govt. of Keralaon "Human Rights and Contemporary Indian Democracy" was conducted by the Department of Economics, S N M College Maliankara on 5th January 2024.

The seminar was inaugurated by **Dr. Jitha T H Principal, Snm College Maliankara** at 10.00 am. The session began with welcome address by **Sri. Nikhil M B**, Head of the Department of Economics, S N M College Maliankara. Special Address delivered by **Dr. M H Remesh Kumar, Assistant Professor Department of History Maharaja's College Ernakulam.** Shri. P M Antony, Ward Member Vadakkekara Grama Panchayath gave the benedictory address and facilitated the programme where he pointed the need to question the socio-political and economic injustice prevailing even after seven decades of national Independence. The Programme Convener, **Smt. Saipriya Sudarsan** extended the Vote of Thanks.

The theme presentation of the seminar was initiated by **Adv**. **Muhamemd Ibrahim Abdulsamad, Lawyer & Legal Columnist**, his topic was **"Innocent Prisoners In Indian Jails: Human Rights of Accused and Convicts**". He pointed out on law and justice stressing on the significance of the voice of the majority. The most important issue he expressed was the dynamic influence of various concepts in the Human Rights. It was highly a thought provoking talk on the very concept of Human Rights and social justice in a very novel way. Presentation was so brief but to the point and was very impressive in every sense of the word.


The second talk was by **Dr. S Muraleedharan Retd. Professor, Department Of Economics Maharajas College, Ernakulam**, his topic was **"What Are The Challenges To Protecting Both Human Rights And Democracy"** He opined it as the tolerance of the prejudices of the minority and to be considered as the Living physical body'. He also talked on the "law' which is the voice of democracy. He queried whether there are people in the society who are deprived of justices. He talked on pluralities in social justice and on ordinary law and constitutional law. He stressed on social justice mainly on economically weaker sections and pointed out on the economic scaling system. He expressed his views from his own experience he had from several places. Another point he mentioned was about weakness (in a social group) which was evidently experienced during Covid pandemic time (exemplifying from the use of electronic gadgets etc.). He elaborated on power and powerlessness and its complexities in this stratified societies, demanding basic needs.

The second session was by **Dr. Bibin Kuriakose Assistant Professor in History, Marthoma College for Women** and the topic was: **"Contextualising Human Rights in Contemporary India**" Rights are natural and occur as a consequence of human interaction. However, there are not any natural rights and rights are always state given. And also no right is absolute. All rights are subject to the control of state. Definition of human rights according to Indian Constitution is very limited. Human rights may appear as more significant than fundamental rights. Fundamental rights are more important from a legal perspective than human rights. Human right violation need not always be a violation of legal rights. Human rights it can be said that gives only an image of rights.

10. Outcome of the event / Evaluation by Program Coordinator:

The seminar was very effective in giving insight to the students about Human Rights and Contemporary Indian Democracy. At the end of each session, the Participants could clear their doubts about the topics presented by the resource persons. All the presentations were thought provoking and interesting to the students.
